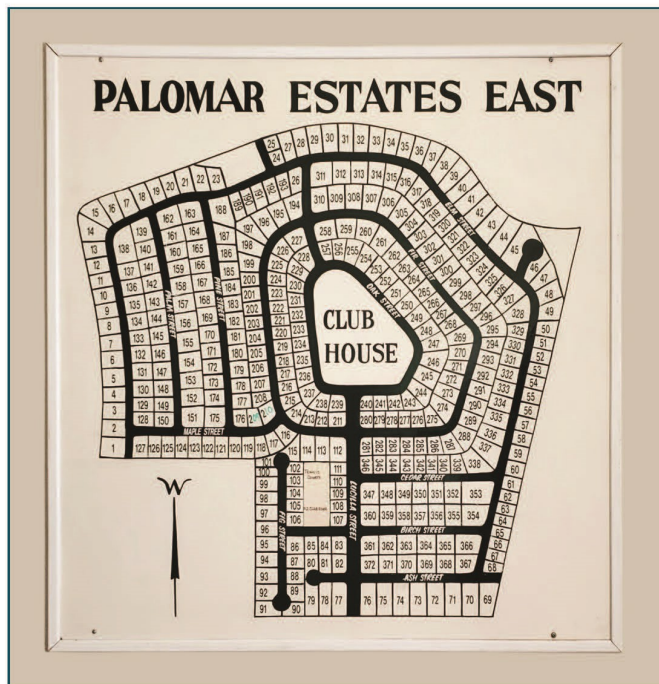

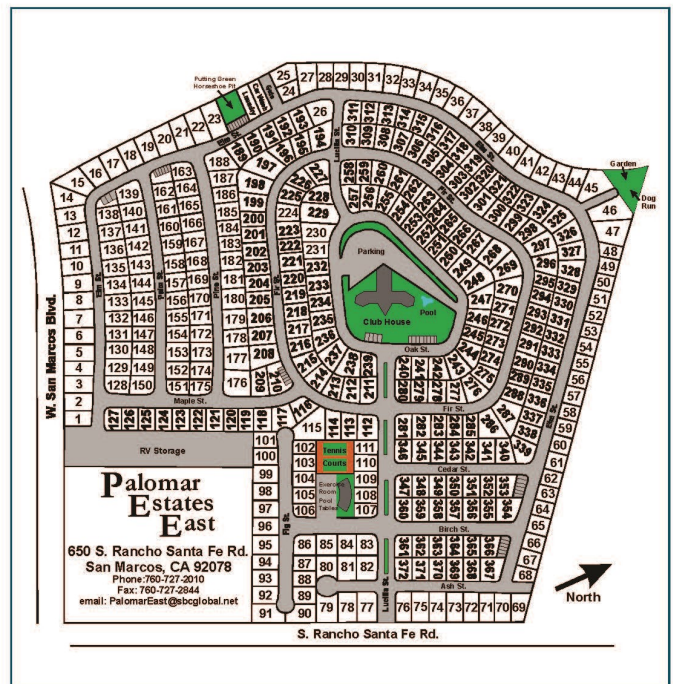


Entrance Welcome Map

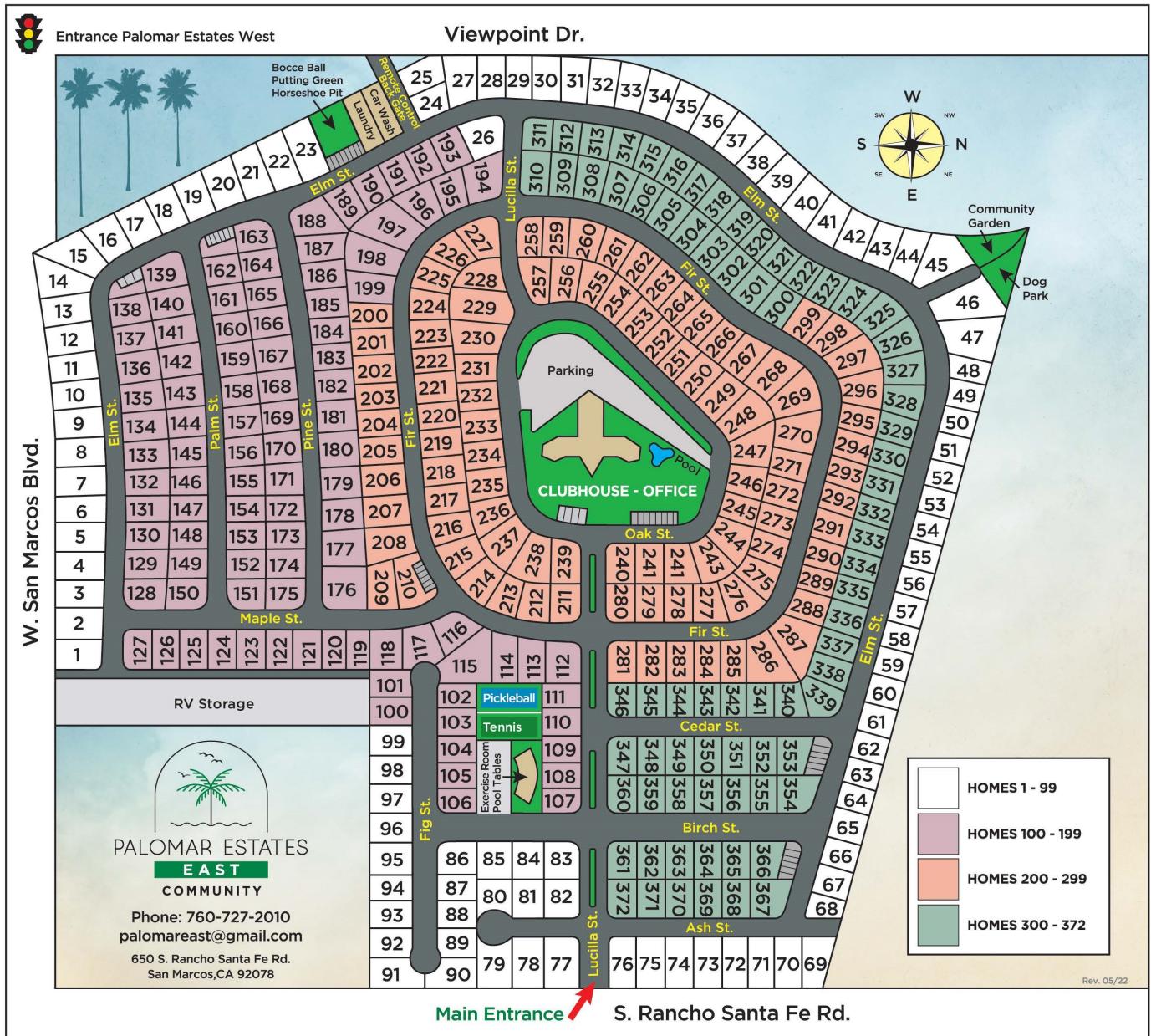


Clubhouse Map

What is a Pearl?



A pearl is a hard object that is produced in the soft tissue (especially the mantle) of a living mollusk (**mussels, oysters, and clams**). Like its shell, pearls consist of calcium carbonate in the form of crystals that have been deposited in concentric layers. The ideal pearl is one that is perfectly round and smooth, but there are a variety of other shapes as well.

Any mollusk is capable of producing a **pearl**, although only those mollusks that have shells lined with **nacre** (the iridescent internal layer of a mollusk shell) produce **pearls** that are used in the jewelry industry.

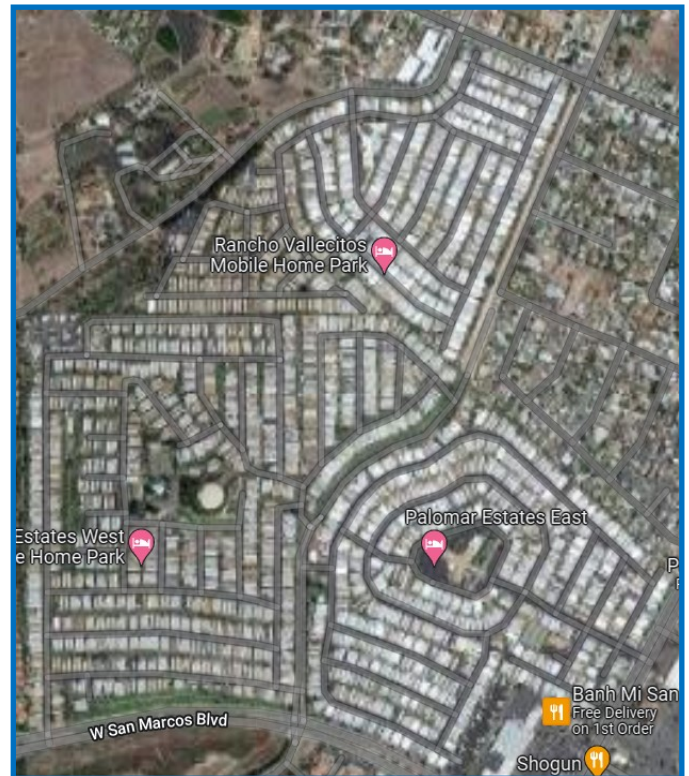

Until All the Pieces Fit

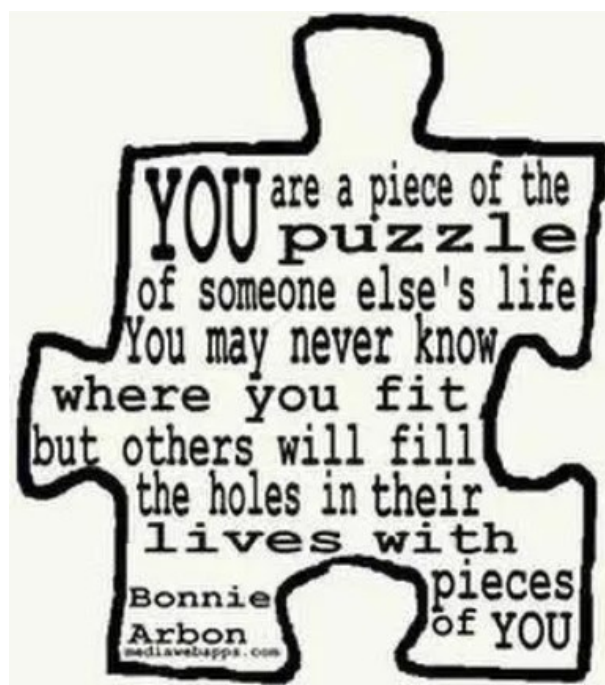
